

## **Enforcement Division Staff Report August 28, 2018**

### **Case Highlights**

#### **Case No. EAB20180007364**

In the Matter of 13219 Highway 183, Ltd.

On July 20, 2018, an agreed order was entered against 13219 Highway 183, Ltd., assessing an administrative penalty of \$750 for failing to schedule an inspection within one year of construction completion. The administrative penalty was paid in full.

**Organizational Changes**

- When the EAB section was calibrated earlier this year, the position held by Bob Posey was removed, meaning that there will no longer be a manager over the EAB program alone. The current structure of the EAB team is now five program specialists (Marsha Godeaux, Norman Kieke, Laura Montes, Crisi Cooper and Laura Montes) with one multi-program manager (Charlotte Melder). All Administrative support positions were moved to the Support and Training Team to assist with all RPM programs.
- Within the team, Marsha Godeaux has been promoted to a Program Specialist VI, which carries team lead responsibilities. This means that she will have additional responsibilities within the team including taking over making the sections presentations to the advisory committee. Marsha has been working in EAB for almost 10 years as a plan reviewer and auditor and is an excellent choice for this promotion! Congratulations Marsha!
- Crisi Cooper has also been promoted. However, she has been promoted to a multi-program specialist position and will no longer be a part of the EAB team but will still be available to answer questions and such if need be. Congratulations Crisi!
- The EAB section is hoping to fill Crisi's position as soon as possible.

**Public Outreach and Education**

- Norman attended The Coalition of Texans with Disabilities on June 1, 2018.
- Norman met with University of Texas Parking & Transportation Services on June 14, 2018.
- Marsha and Norman met with the Texas Historical Commission on June 25, 2018 with regards to the MOU and San Saba Courthouse.
- The two-day Texas Accessibility Academy was presented in Austin July 10-11, 2018. Norman Kieke and Crisi Cooper taught the class. The Academy was also conducted August 14-15, 2018 with Marsha filling in for Crisi. Mike Fleharty handled registration and confirmation and was present to assist with logistics and to handle technical questions. Fifty-two people attended.
- Norman and Charlotte attended The Texas Department of Transportation, ADA Celebration on June 23, 2018.
- Norman attended the July 16-17, 2018 quarterly meeting of the Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities in Edinburg, Texas as the TDLR liaison. Updates were provided on multiple TDLR programs which directly impact persons with disabilities.
- Norman presented "Rock Out to TAS" at AIA-Austin Annual Conference on August 23, 2018 at Austin's AT&T Conference Center. Both Charlotte and Crisi were also in attendance to support Norman. The presentation is set to re-worded popular songs constructed and performed by Rob Roy Parnell, (and his band), AB Advisory Committee member and RAS, along with Jack Stamps, Lead Investigator, TBAE.

## Projects

- Regulatory Program Management Division staff are diligently working with Software Development Services on Texas Architectural Barriers System (TABS), a replacement for the legacy software database tracking program currently in use. We are on track for completion in the near future. The team has begun development of training and instructional videos to be posted on the TDLR website, as well as beginning preparation for beta testing with selected individuals in the public sector.
