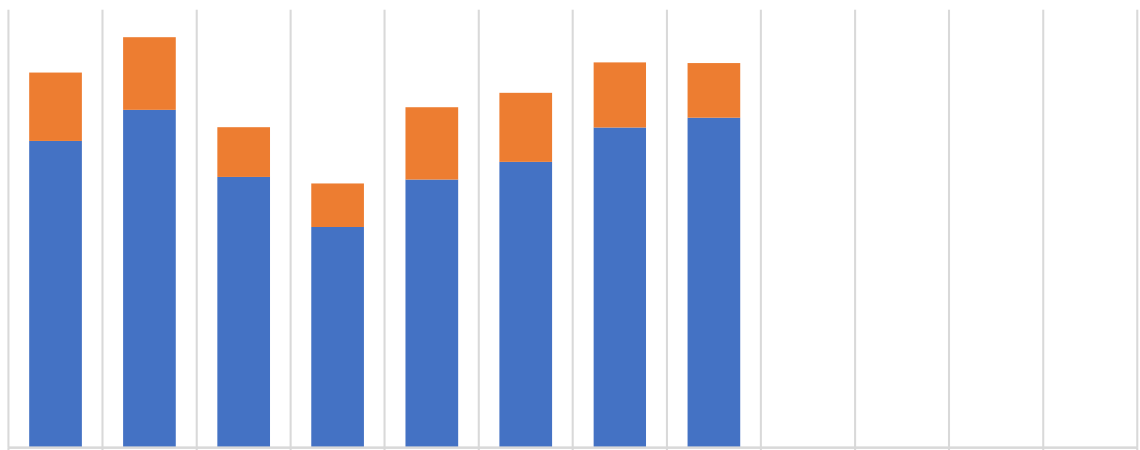

ADVISORY BOARD ON COSMETOLOGY

Enforcement Division Staff Report

May 21, 2018

Case Highlights

- On April 9, 2018, an Agreed Order was issued against Miguel Medina d/b/a AM Beauty College assessing an administrative penalty in the amount of \$1,500 for failing to calculate a student's refund after withdrawal according to cosmetology school administrative rules.
- On April 4, 2018, a Default Order was issued against Boeau Belle Ltd., Inc. d/b/a Boeau Belle Salon and Spa revoking their dual barber shop and beauty shop license for the failure to pay administrative penalties resulting out of a previous Default Order issued by the Department.
- On April 4, 2018, a Default Order was issued against Laser Derm LLC assessing an administrative penalty in the amount of \$1,000 for operating a place of business where cosmetology was practiced without having the facility license issued by the Department.
- On November 13, 2017, an Agreed Order was issued against Hue Bich Nguyen assessing an administrative penalty in the amount of \$750 for performing cosmetology services without first obtaining the required operator's license issued by the Department.
- On January 24, 2018, an Agreed Order was issued against Tri M. Tran d/b/a Galleria Nails and Spa assessing an administrative penalty in the amount of \$750 for failing to properly clean and sanitize whirlpool foot spas at the end of the day.

Cosmetology Most Common Violations Found During Inspections

2nd Quarter, Fiscal Year 2018

1. Failed to post salon license in public view or post individual licenses and booth rental (independent contractor) licenses with a current photograph at the licensee's work station or in a notebook. – Tex. Occupations Code Section 1602.401; 16 Tex. Admin. Code 83.70(e, f). A person holding a license or certificate issued under this chapter shall display the license or certificate in the person's place of business or employment. Individual licenses and booth rental (independent contractor) licenses may be posted at the licensee's work station in the public view or be made available in a notebook at the salon reception desk. A current photograph of the licensee approximately 1^{1/2} inches by 1^{1/2} inches shall be attached to the front of the license, certificate, or permit.

2. Failure to have rest room on or near premises without stored chemicals. - 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 83.114(e). Every establishment shall provide at least one restroom located on or near the premises of the establishment. For public safety, chemical supplies shall not be stored in the restroom.

3. Establishment, furniture, equipment, and/or fixtures are unclean or are not in good repair. - 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 83.114(a). Establishments shall keep the floors, walls, ceilings, shelves, furniture, furnishings, and fixtures clean and in good repair. Any cracks, holes, or other similar disrepair not readily accessible for cleaning shall be repaired or filled in to create a smooth, washable surface.

4. Failure to keep a record of the date and time of each daily or bi-weekly cleaning. - 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 83.108(e, g, k, l). For whirlpool foot spas, a record shall be made on a department-approved form of the date and time of each cleaning and disinfecting indicating whether the cleaning was a daily or bi-weekly cleaning. This record shall be made at or near the time of cleaning and disinfecting and shall indicate if a spa was not used during any individual work day.

5. Salon failed to maintain a list of all booth renters (independent contractors). - 16 Tex. Admin Code Ch.83.71(c). Salons may lease space to an independent contractor who holds a booth rental (independent contractor) license. The lessor to an independent contractor must maintain a list of all renters that includes the name of renter and the cosmetology license number of the renter. The lessor must supply the department inspector with a list of renters upon request.

6. Failure to keep all products used in the conduct of business properly labeled in compliance with OSHA requirements. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 83.102(m). Each cosmetology establishment shall keep all products used in the conduct of their business properly labeled in compliance with OSHA requirements.

7. Failure to store clean implements in a clean, dry, debris-free environment or failure to separate clean implements from soiled implements or non-cosmetology supplies. - 16 Tex. Admin Code Ch. 83.102(f). All clean and disinfected implements and materials when not in use shall be stored in a clean, dry, debris-free environment including but not limited to drawers, cases, tool belts, rolling trays, or hung from hooks. They must be stored separate from soiled implements and materials. Ultraviolet electrical sanitizers are permissible for use as a dry storage container. Non-cosmetology related supplies must be stored in separate drawers or locations.

8. Failure to display Notification of Public Interest Information and Participation. - Tex. Occupations Code Section 1603.151(2). Salons must notify consumers and service recipients of the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the department for the purpose of directing complaints to the department regarding barbering and cosmetology on a sign prominently displayed in the place of business.

9. Salon failed to post the most recent inspection report issued by the department in a conspicuous place clearly visible to the public. - 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 83.71(l) Cosmetology establishments shall display in the establishment, in a conspicuous place clearly visible to the public, a copy of the establishment's most recent inspection report issued by the department.

10. Failure to prepare fresh disinfectant daily or more often if solution becomes diluted or soiled. – 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 83.101(a)(3). Disinfectants in which implements are to be immersed shall be prepared fresh daily or more often if solution becomes diluted or soiled.

Division Projects

Prevention of Human Trafficking

The office of Strategic Communication printed a double-sided Prevention of Human Trafficking poster in color for the field inspectors to pass out during their inspections. Each side of the poster has a different design so the licensees can choose which design they prefer. These posters will be more noticeable by the public.

Mini Salon Round Ups

Field staff in the East, North and South Regions have completed 51 mini-salon round-ups throughout Texas, completing approximately 2863 inspections this fiscal year so far.

Outreach

Public Information Officer Brenda Flores-Dollar and Communication Specialist Doug Van Pelt accompanied Field Inspector Ginette Devastey on several nail and hair salons inspections in the Austin area. This gave Brenda and Doug insight on the inspection procedures.
