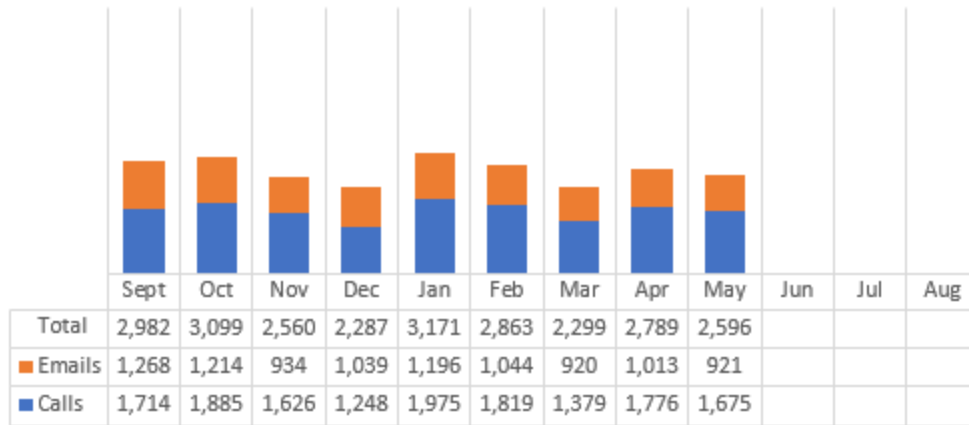

MESSAGE THERAPY ADVISORY BOARD**JUNE 11TH, 2019****EDUCATION SERVICES UPDATES****BILL UPDATES THAT WILL HAVE AN IMPACT IN E&E**

HB 1865: Relating to the licensing and regulation of Massage Therapy; requiring a student permit; authorizing fees.

HB 2747: Relating to certain notice requirements applicable to massage therapy – requiring massage schools to post Human Trafficking information.

If either HB 1865 or HB 2747 go into effect, our Division is making the necessary preparations to anticipate the logistics of what will be needed to implement the student permit requirements for schools and the notice requirements for posting Human Trafficking information. We will plan regional meetings to educate the schools on the new requirements and we will work directly with IT Services to make the necessary accommodations.

Massage Therapy Advisory Board

Enforcement Division Staff Report

June 11, 2019

Current Projects

- On March 19, met with the Enforcement Workgroup of the Massage Therapy Advisory Board to develop a penalty matrix for this program. The workgroup, consisting of four members of the advisory board, worked in collaboration with enforcement staff to complete a draft of the matrix. This draft matrix is on the agenda today for the advisory board's consideration. The advisory board members appointed to this workgroup are Antonio Gracia Jr, Raymond "Russell" Rust, Carol Willess, and Karen Vasquez.
- On April 17, enforcement hosted a training by Austin Police Department Sergeant Kevin Covington, who works on APD's Human Trafficking Unit. Sgt. Covington described the composition of his unit, and how they handle cases relating human trafficking and child exploitation. He also shared his experience with human trafficking in businesses that offer massage, and the potential trafficking signs that Department staff may witness while conducting inspections or investigations.

Case Highlights

Case No. MAS20180003069 - Xiaolin Yang (Respondent) d/b/a New Shanghai Spa

On March 25, 2019, the Executive Director signed an agreed order that finalized the settlement agreement between the Department and Xiaolin Yang (Respondent) d/b/a New Shanghai Spa. As part of this negotiated settlement, Respondent accepted liability for two separate instances of individuals engaging in sexual contact on the massage establishment premises. The Department discovered these violations in May 2018, when the Georgetown Police Department notified a Department Investigator that the GTPD had executed search warrants recently at New Shanghai Spa, and that as a result of those warrants (i) on May 17, 2018, Respondent was charged with the second-degree felony offense of Aggravated Promotion of Prostitution, and (ii) on May 24, 2018, Yuexia Sun, an individual employed by Respondent who was on the premises when the warrants were executed, was charged with the Class B misdemeanor offense of Prostitution. To resolve these two violations, Respondent agreed to pay the Department an administrative penalty of \$6,000, and to the revocation of New Shanghai Spa's business license.

Case No. MAS20190002816 – Mei Wang (Respondent) d/b/a Relax

On April 4, 2019, the Executive Director signed an agreed order that finalized the settlement agreement between the Department and Respondent. As part of this negotiated settlement, Respondent accepted liability for having allowed three (3) unlicensed individuals perform massage therapy for clients of Relax. Each individual initially claimed to be providing reflexology services, but our Investigator gathered sufficient evidence to prove these services were massage, as all involved manipulation above the client's feet including the thighs. To resolve these three violations, Respondent agreed to pay the Department an administrative penalty of \$5,625.

Case Nos. MAS20180007619 & MAS20180007627 - Arturo Chamberlain (Respondent)

On August 14, 2018, the Executive Director granted the Department's Motion for Default against Respondent. The order found Respondent committed three separate instances of sexual assault, specifically: (i) on or about July 12, 2016, during a massage therapy session, Respondent touched his client's breast without her written consent, and (ii) on or about July 13, 2016, during a massage therapy session, Respondent touched his client's breast without her written consent; and (iii) during that same July 13 session, Respondent touched his client's genitals. Based on these findings, the Executive Director revoked Respondent's massage therapist's license.

Case No. MAS20180008234 - Jonathan "Lance" Lechtenberg (Respondent)

On or about April 29, 2008, Respondent was licensed as a Massage Therapist. This license expired January 31, 2018.

TEX. OCC. CODE § 455.152(a) states a person is not eligible for a license as a massage therapist, if the person is convicted of a sexual offense, including assaults by contact if the offense is a sexual act.

On or about October 18, 2016, in a case heard by the Dallas Municipal Court No. 7, Respondent was convicted of assault by contact. The specific assaultive act Respondent committed was touching the victim with Respondent's erect penis while the victim lay on the massage therapy table. And since this assault itself is an illegal sexual act, it is considered by the Department to be a sexual offense.

Thus, on April 9, 2019, the Department notified Respondent his Massage Therapist license was revoked by operation of law, effective October 18, 2016, i.e., the date Respondent was convicted of assault by contact.

MOST COMMON VIOLATIONS FOUND DURING INSPECTIONS

Licensed Massage Therapy Establishment Most Common Violations Found During Inspections
Fiscal Year 2019 Quarter 1

1. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.82(a)(1-3) A massage establishment shall employ or contract with only licensed massage therapists to perform massage therapy or other massage services. Documentation of the employment or contract relationship and verification that the licensed massage therapist is a United States citizen or a legal permanent resident with a valid work permit shall be maintained by the massage establishment and made available during an inspection or investigation.

2. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.82(h)(2) A massage establishment shall maintain a current list of all establishment employees and/or contractors at all times which includes: (A) full name; and (B) license number and expiration date (if licensed as a massage therapist).

3. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.91(a)(3) The consultation document shall include a statement that the licensee shall not engage in breast massage of female clients without the written consent of the client.

4. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.90(q) A licensee shall notify each client of the name, mailing address, telephone number, and web address of the department for the purpose of directing complaints to the department

5. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.91(a)(6) The consultation document shall include the signature of both the client and the licensee.

6. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.91(a)(1) The consultation document shall include the type of massage therapy services or techniques the licensee anticipates using during the massage therapy session.

7. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.91(a)(5) The consultation document shall include a statement that if uncomfortable for any reason, the client may ask the licensee to cease the massage and the licensee will end the massage session.

8. Tex. Occ. Code Ch. 455.202(c); 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.82(h)(1) A massage establishment shall properly maintain and secure for each client the initial consultation documents, all session notes, and related billing records.

9. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.91(a)(4) The consultation document shall include a statement that draping will be used during the session, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by both the client and the licensee.

10. 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 117.91(a)(2) The consultation document shall include the parts of the client's body that will be massaged or the areas of the client's body that will be avoided during the session, including indications and contraindications.

Licensed Massage Therapy Schools Most Common Violations Found During Inspections

Regulatory Program Management (RPM) Staff Report
Massage Therapy Advisory Board Meeting

June 11, 2019

Personnel Update

- Jerry Gonzalez is our new Massage Therapy, Barber and Cosmetology Programs Specialist in RPM's Business and Professionals Section. He began his duties on March 1st and is the lead on the Massage Therapy Program, assisting Jennifer Harless with our Human Trafficking initiatives, and assisting Elizabeth Perez and Marinela LaFleur with the Barber and Cosmetology Programs. Jerry came to us from the Education and Examination Division and has over 28 years of experience working in massage therapy regulation.

Update Regarding Massage Therapy Program Activities

- After conducting extensive research on other jurisdictions' licensing requirements, Elizabeth Perez and Marinela La Fleur finalized the Massage Therapy Substantial Equivalency Table on January 28th. The Equivalency Table is used by the Licensing Division when assessing out-of-state license applications.
- Jerry Gonzalez and Elizabeth worked with the Advisory Board Enforcement Workgroup, including Enforcement Division staff on March 19th to develop the Massage Therapy Program Penalty Matrix.
- Jerry, Elizabeth, and Marinela attended a meeting provided by the Education and Examination Division with the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards (FSMTB) on March 29th. The meeting consisted of the FSMTB providing a presentation of the services they offer for each member state, along with the administration of the national examination (MBLEx).
- Jerry, Elizabeth, and Marinela worked with the Advisory Board Education Workgroup and Education and Examination Division staff on April 26th to review proposed rule revisions for Subchapter F, Massage Schools.
- Jerry, Elizabeth, and Marinela have researched and provided valuable information for executive office and legislative inquiries during the session.
- RPM program staff continue to assist Enforcement, Field Inspections, Licensing and Customer Service with inquiries that arise during investigations, inspections, as well as addressing daily industry questions and emails.
