San Antonio Massage Therapist, Instructor License Suspended After Alleged Sexual Assault of Client

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) has issued an emergency order suspending the massage therapist and massage instructor licenses of a San Antonio man accused of sexually assaulting a client while he was providing massage therapy services.

Kodi Nathaniel Jackson is prohibited from working as a massage therapist or a massage instructor until the criminal case against him has been adjudicated.

About TDLR

TDLR provides regulatory oversight for a broad range of occupations, businesses, facilities, and equipment in Texas, including the Texas Lottery and Charitable Bingo programs. The agency protects the health and safety of Texans by ensuring they are served by qualified, licensed professionals. Inspections of individuals, businesses, and equipment are done on a regular basis to safeguard the public. Currently, the agency regulates 41 business and occupational licensing programs with more than 1,000,000 licensees across the state.
