

Health Professions Section Update

- The Health Professions Section remains focused on maintaining the successful operation of the Phase I programs.
- Section staff are continuing their work on the SB 202, Phase II program transition, which occurred on 11/1/2017. In Phase II, six additional programs from DSHS transferred to TDLR (massage therapy, sanitarians, code enforcement officers, offender education providers, mold assessors/remediators, and laser hair removal facilities/personnel).

TDLR RECALIBRATION

As part of TDLR's recent recalibration, effective March 1, 2108, the school inspection function was moved from the Exams and Education division to the Field Inspections division.

FIELD INSPECTION DIVISION OVERVIEW

The Field Inspections division is organized into three Regions and a Training, Support and Analytics Section:

- **The North Region** – Joe Carrasco manages the Fort Worth field office and 13 inspectors.
- **The South Region** – Manager position is open – manages the Austin office and 11 inspectors.
- **The East Region** – CamTu Tran, manages the Houston field office and 11 inspectors.
- **The Support, Training, and Analytics Team** monitors work load performance, provides training, monitors and implements technology such as route optimization and electronic inspection programs, manages the mold remediation notification system and third-party inspections, and provides general support to ensure the success of the Field Inspections division.

MIDWIFERY SCHOOL INSPECTION PROCEDURES

Field Inspections staff is working with staff from Exams and Education and Regulatory Program Management to draft and document inspection procedures. Once we have a draft we will bring it to an advisory board workgroup.
