TDLR Releases Latest List of Unlicensed Service Providers

Complete TDLR list available online

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation has released the newest list of people who are no longer authorized to perform or offer to perform licensed services in Texas. TDLR urges consumers not to hire unlicensed service providers.

The list includes actions taken in December 2020 and January and February 2021 to safeguard consumers and protect public health and safety.

Included in the licenses revoked were a midwife – who used a mechanical device to advance labor and failed to recommend and complete a patient transfer when a prenatal condition existed that required an immediate transfer to a hospital – and a podiatrist, who failed to practice podiatry in an acceptable manner consistent with public health and welfare.

“People working in professions and industries without the proper license can pose a risk to your health, your safety, and your wallet. TDLR provides the Safeguarding Consumers webpage as one way to help ensure the safety of consumers – and to protect small businesses that are complying with state laws. Before you hire someone, always check with TDLR (<https://www.tdlr.texas.gov/LicenseSearch/>) first to make sure that person is licensed,” said TDLR executive director Brian E. Francis.

Among the other types of violations that would cause a license to be revoked or that would cause TDLR to issue a cease and desist order or a permanent injunction: engaging in fraudulent activity or being convicted of a criminal offense that directly relates to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation, performing services without having the appropriate license or making false statements to obtain a license.
