TDLR releases new list of revoked licenses

Complete TDLR list available online

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) has released the newest list of people who are no longer authorized to perform or offer to perform licensed services in Texas. TDLR urges consumers not to hire unlicensed service providers.

The enforcement actions included those taken against three licensees who either allowed sexual activities to occur in their licensed massage establishment or who engaged in sexual contact with a client during a massage therapy session. Enforcement actions also were taken against licensees who made false statements about their criminal histories and against people who performed unlicensed services.

The list includes actions taken in March and April 2021 to safeguard consumers and protect public health and safety.

Anyone listed on the Safeguarding Texans page are not authorized to perform, or offer to perform, licensed services in Texas. Please see https://www.tdlr.texas.gov/safeguardingconsumers.htm for additional details on each action.
