TDLR releases new list of revoked licenses

Complete TDLR list available online

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) has released the newest list of people who are no longer authorized to perform or offer to perform licensed services in Texas. TDLR urges consumers not to hire unlicensed service providers.

The enforcement actions included license revocations of two licensees in San Antonio who engaged in sexual contact with clients during massage therapy sessions.

Enforcement actions also were taken against licensees who made false statements about their criminal histories and against people who performed unlicensed services.

The list includes actions taken in April and May 2021 to safeguard consumers and protect public health and safety.

Anyone listed on the Safeguarding Texans page are not authorized to perform, or offer to perform, licensed services in Texas. Please see <https://www.tdlr.texas.gov/safeguardingconsumers.htm> for additional details on each action.
