TDLR Releases New List Of Revoked Licenses

Complete TDLR list available online

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) has released the newest list of people who are no longer authorized to perform or offer to perform licensed services in Texas. This latest list includes actions TDLR has taken since August 2022 to safeguard consumers and protect public health and safety.

TDLR issued cease and desist orders against two massage establishments, two massage therapists and a vehicle storage facility in its latest Safeguarding Consumers campaign. The agency also revoked a massage establishment license and an air conditioning and refrigeration license.
