TDLR Lists Recently Revoked Licenses

Complete TDLR list available online – Check that license before hiring someone

AUSTIN – The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation has released the newest list of people who are no longer authorized to perform or offer to perform certain licensed services in Texas. TDLR urges consumers not to hire unlicensed service providers.

Included in this month's list are several individuals whose massage therapist licenses were revoked because they were found to have engaged in or allowed sexual contact with clients, as well as several individuals who made false statements about their criminal histories in order to obtain a license.

TDLR reminds consumers that people working in professions and industries without the proper license can pose a risk to your health, your safety, and your wallet.

Before you hire someone, always check with TDLR (<https://www.tdlr.texas.gov/LicenseSearch/>) first to make sure that person is licensed. Most TDLR licensees are glad to provide their licensing information to consumers for verification.

This month's list includes actions taken in August and September by TDLR Executive Director Brian E. Francis and the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation to safeguard consumers and protect public health and safety. Some individuals or businesses may be able to reapply for a license after one year; others are permanently banned from reapplying for or holding a license in Texas.

Among the types of violations that would cause a license to be revoked or that would cause TDLR to issue a cease-and-desist order or a permanent injunction: engaging in fraudulent activity; being convicted of a criminal offense that directly relates to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation; performing services without having the appropriate license; or making false statements to obtain a license.
