Staff Updates

- The Combative Sports Program hired Linda Vargas to fill the vacant Program Specialist position. She is replacing Jerri Dix who retired in July of this year.

Projects

- Combative Sports will conduct training for new regional inspectors in 2017, as well as a refresher course for seasoned inspectors.

Projects

- On November 16, the Commission on Licensing and Regulation approved the nine penalty matrices for the Combative Sports Program. These matrices were approved by the Combative Sports Advisory Board on September 30, 2016.

Case Highlights

- On October 19, a default order in Case Number BOX20160020370 was entered against Karim C. Martinez, a licensed combative sports contestant, assessing an administrative penalty of \$1,000 for testing positive for a prohibited substance before a bout. Mr. Martinez participated in a combative sports event in Dallas, Texas on May 12, 2016, and tested positive for Marijuana Metabolite, a prohibited substance.
- On October 26, a default order in Case Number BOX20160012806 was entered against Agustin Ordorica d/b/a Nord Boxing Promotions LLC, a formerly licensed combative sports promoter, assessing an administrative penalty of \$1,000 for failing to pay the 3% event tax fee of \$1,521.45 owed to the Department, and for failing to pay to the Department the application fees of \$680 for several seconds and contestants as the checks were all not honored by the bank. The Department filed a claim against the promoter's surety bond, and the claim has been paid.
- On October 25, an agreed order in Case Number BOX20160023005 was entered against Peter James Stanonik V, a licensed combative sports contestant, assessing a penalty of \$750 for testing positive for a prohibited substance before a bout. Mr. Stanonik participated in a combative sports event in Dallas, Texas on June 25, 2016, and tested positive for Marijuana Metabolite, a prohibited substance.
